STRIKE ACTION WEDNESDAY 1ST FEBRUARY

As I am sure you will have seen in the press, the teacher's union the NEU have voted to take strike action on 4 days within the next couple of months. The first day of striking is Wednesday 1st February. Currently the other teacher unions haven't voted to take strike action.

At Windmill the staff belong to different unions. Some of them are NEU members and some belong to the unions that have chosen not to take strike action yet. Although they may not be striking teachers want you to know that they still support the actions that their colleagues are taking in the NEU.

Teachers do not take strike action lightly. This is the link to the NEU guidance which gives more details about the reasons that teachers are taking action. For most of the staff at Windmill it is concerns about school funding which are driving their decision and not pay.

School Communication

School app

Official school notices to parents about things like school events and clubs and the weekly newsletter. Things like last minute cancellations of clubs are posted here. Search for "School App for Parents" on the App Store. Username Windmill, password 2527 to log in to Windmill School.

Newsletter

Mrs Knapp's weekly newsletter which is delivered through the app and details events happening in school, key dates and lots of information. A useful weekly summary of everything in one place. It can also be viewed on the school website www.windmill.oxon.sch.uk.

Classlist

This is for communication between parents. You can post messages to your class, year group, whole school or many other groups. This is the PTA's main tool of communication and notices of events or points of interest are posted here. We aim to post messages from the app here too. It is a brilliant tool and the place where most 'official' class communication goes. You do not need to share your phone number or personal details. Download Class-list on the AppStore and search for Windmill School.

Seesaw

This is how homework is set in Y1-6 and is submitting work and sending messages to teachers. Sometimes class notices are posted on Seesaw. You will need a password to log in.

Tapestry

This is just used in Reception (in place of Seesaw) and is a tool for home school communication between class teachers and parents. Updates and photos are posted here. You will need a password to log in.

WhatsApp groups

Many classes have a WhatsApp group. Ask your class rep about yours.

Social Media

Windmill School is on Facebook and many classes have their own Twitter page, some more active than others. Search and follow to see what classes are up to.

Paper letters. Sometimes paper letters come home too (depending on the reliability of your child). It is worth checking school bags.

School Gateway

This app is less about communication and more about payment. Payment for lunches, breakfast club and trips is through this app.
