#### Please read: we need someone to take over the Second Hand Uniform shop by September

Due to increased involvement with Quarry Rovers and Cheney, I need to step away from Windmill Second-Hand Uniform. I will help with any training and transition.

I set this up in October 2021 after the Autumn Fayre was cancelled that year (COVID). It was Ricarda Menke's work and initiative that got this up and running. In that time, we've sold over 1200 pieces of uniform and have raised £1000 for the PTA.

The time commitment varies, but averages to about 1-2hrs/week, maybe more when lots of donations are received. I also visit the school one hour every month to photograph lost property (hence the lost property photos you see posted every month or so) and to pick-up more stock. The school has a person who does a great job sorting through things so it's not a huge messy pile that it once was.

IT skills required are minimal- we pay Uniformd a fee to use their platform so it really is just a matter of amending the number of items when new donations arrive and fulfilling orders as they come in.

Storage space required- see photos on classlist. I currently have 2 boxes for cardigans/jumpers, 1 box for trousers, 2 boxes for skirts/shorts, 1 box for dresses, 1 box for PE stuff and another box for other miscellaneous things (tights, bags, plimsoles, etc). If you decide this is too much, you can always decide to cut down what the shop carries.

#### School Dinners / Packed Lunch

The cost of school dinners for term 1 (Tues 5Sept - Fri 20 Oct) is £81.60. Please note that school meals must be ordered and paid for in advance. If you pay weekly, payments (£12.00) must be paid by Monday morning for the week ahead. Please use the School Gateway App to make lunch money payments.

A reminder that pupils must have either school meals all term or packed lunches all term, we cannot cater for children having meals on odd days.

IMPORTANT - If your child would like to switch their meal preference, please email the school office on <a href="mailto:office.2527@windmill.oxon.sch.uk">office.2527@windmill.oxon.sch.uk</a> on or before the first day of term. If we are unaware that your child has switched from packed lunch to school dinner, a dinner will not have been ordered for them and if your child switches from school dinner to packed lunch and you have not informed the office, you will be charged for the meal that has been prepared.

Year 2 - May we also remind current Year 2 parents and carers that once your child reaches Year 3 you will need to start paying for school dinners. If you no longer wish your child to have a dinner then please let the Office staff know as soon as possible as you will be charged if you do not make us aware.

If you are in receipt of any income related benefits you may still be able to claim free school meals, please check with the office if you think you may be eligible. The office email address is office.2527@windmill.oxon.sch.uk.


