School Concepts:
Sustainability and resistance.



Forest biomes and protecting planet Earth.

Inquiry question:

Do we have the power to change the world?

Should habitats be destroyed so that people can have what they want?

Humanities

In geography we will:

Develop our use of atlases and map skills to locate the world's forest biomes.

Look at the climate of 3 of the world's forest biomes: tropical Rainforest, temperate forest and deciduous woodland.

Look at the flora and fauna in these different forest biomes.

Look at how humans interact with the Earth and its resources, and the impact that this has.

Climate change and the impact that this is having on the earth.



PE: We will be looking at developing some of our core stability skills- such as our ability to balance and carry out increasingly complex actions, that involve control of our feet and legs.

English

Classic Poetry: The Highwayman.

Narrative writing based around 'The Lion King' We will have a real focus on developing our vocabulary, and selecting the vocabulary that we use for maximum impact. We will also develop our use of adding clauses to provide extra information.

Non-chronological report:

We will be writing a non-chronological report on emperor penguins.

Biography: We will look at the life of David Attenborough and write a biography around this.

Maths

Number and place value: To read, write, order and compare numbers to at least 1,000,000 and determine the value of each digit.

Addition and Subtraction: To add and subtract whole numbers with more than 4 digits, including using formal written methods. This will also be applied to a range of word problems.

Multiplication and Division: Multiply numbers up to 4 digits by a one or two-digit number using a formal written method, including long
