STRIKE ACTION THURSDAY 2ND MARCH

On Thursday 2nd March members of the NEU teaching union will be on strike . As on the previous strike the school will be partially closed. Please see the table below for which classes will be open and which will be closed.

Message from the NEU members

Thanks for overwhelming support of our strike action. It was heart-warming to talk to so many of you on the picket line and great to receive treats that helped to sustain us. A member of the press reported that having visited many picket lines over the years, ours was incredibly positive. In addition, thank you to all those parents who felt strongly enough to talk to the press on our behalf.

However, as you are probably aware our aims have not as yet been met, so for this reason we will be joining together for a second strike on Thursday. The teachers and TAs who will be striking are taking this step because they feel they must let the public know about their concern about the future of the profession. They are worried that they cannot provide the quality of education that children deserve. They do not believe that the government has a strategy to sort out the workforce crisis – a crisis which will only get worse if nothing is done to pay teachers and support staff properly for the essential work they do. They want to solve this dispute.

As a school, we have chosen to support those staff who are taking strike action by not covering their classes. This means that there will be a partial school closure. If your child's class is marked as closed your child will be unable to come to school on Thursday 2nd March

Identity Based Bullying

We have been focusing on Identity based bullying in PHSE lessons and in our school improvement priorities. Recent feedback from children showed that they are all very clear that racist language is completely unacceptable and they know that it will be taken very seriously if heard in school. However, the children didn't seem to be so clear that homophobic language is also completely unacceptable. In the assembly on Monday we talked about being proud of being who we are and our own identity. I made it clear that use of the word "gay" in a derogatory way or as an insult will be treated in the same way as racist language and behaviour is. We would request that you support this at home too.

Reports

We apologise if your child's report didn't arrive on the last day of term. We aren't really sure why many reports sent by a class teacher did arrive and others didn't when the correct email was being used and the same process was being used for all reports. We are looking into how we can resolve this issue for when we send out the reports in July.


