Oxford Kidical Mass bike ride for families

Join us on Sunday 7th May for a guided mass ride starting at 1pm from four areas of Oxford.

We aim to reach Broad St by 2pm for a celebratory 1 mile loop round the city.

The guided rides will then leave Broad St at 3pm to return to each starting point. All the rides are marshalled and carefully controlled especially at junctions. As much as possible they are off road or on quiet roads. All children must be accompanied by an adult.

We plan to have a bubble bike in Broad St for children to pedal. Feel free to join the rides along the way - each ride took about 40 minutes so you can estimate when to expect them along the way.

As before rides are starting from John Radcliffe Helipad, Flo's in the Park cafe and Ferry Centre car park – arrive in time to leave at 1pm.
