Parking Issues in Neighbouring Streets

I have received the following request from another parent to strongly discourage parents from parking on the corners of the roads that adjoin the School Street Zone.

Since the School Street started we now have a big issue with people parking on the corner of St Anne's Road and Margaret Road while they take their children into school. This used to be a junction not many cars turned down, but now it is quite a busy junction with a lot of cars turning to avoid passing through the closure zone. Cars parked on the corners mean that if you are escorting young children across that road, you are having to step right out into the road before you can see whether a car is approaching, and drivers can't see the children until they are out in the road because they are stepping out between parked cars. I'm certain that this is caused by parents at the school as the cars only appear at pick up and drop off times. There are usually at least two cars parked on the corner at this junction and sometimes 4 or 5. (I don't know what the situation is with the other junctions onto Margaret Road as we don't walk that way, but this one may be the worst as there are limited legal and safe places to park on St Anne's road - there are also cars parked on double yellows blocking residents' driveways every day, but I'll leave that to the local Residents Association to take up).

I imagine that people who park there have got in the habit as it is easy and convenient, and probably don't realise the impact they are having on the safety of other children trying to cross that junction on foot.

Sadly it feels to me as though our particular walk to school has become more dangerous since the ANPR came into force.


