Forest School Needs You!

Forest School at Windmill is an important part of the curriculum and is rooted in the school ethos of achievement through community, creativity and challenge. It is child-led and is hugely important in enabling children to develop physical fitness, social skills, resilience and an understanding of the natural environment through investigation, exploration and free play. Forest School helps children to build the connection with the natural world which has been widely shown to support mental health and well-being.

In order to support Forest School in years 1 and 2 we need a high adult: child ratio as we take the children off site to Stansfeld Park (part of Science Oxford). This is a difficult time and we understand that many parents have to work and are not able to help. But if we don't have enough staff we can't run Forest School for years 1 and 2.

In addition to asking year 1 and 2 parents and carers, we are hoping to find volunteers from the wider school community who might be able to offer to help at Forest School.

Are you a parent or carer or do you have a close relative or family friend who enjoys being outside with children in all weather? Would you like to volunteer at Forest School? No particular skills are required beyond patience, enthusiasm and being prepared to get a bit wet and muddy sometimes!

We run Forest School for year 1 on a Thursday morning between 9.05 and 12.45 and the same times on a Tuesday morning for year 2. If you are interested in finding out more about helping at Forest School please do get in touch with Sarah Howard at

Starting Year 7 in secondary school in September 2024 Children normally born between 1 September 2012 and 31 August 2013 inclusive

We are writing to tell you that you need to apply for your child to start Year 7 in a secondary school in September 2024. It is important you read all the information in this letter before you start your application.

How to apply

If you have already applied, please disregard this letter. There is no need to contact us about this. We apologise for any inconvenience.

On our website is all the information you need to know so that you can apply for a secondary school place for your child: oxfordshire.gov.uk/secondaryadmissions

If you do not have internet access, you should visit your child's current school or a local library where you will be able to view the 'Moving On' composite prospectus online and you can ask the school office to print a copy of the paper application form for you.

Apply online and on time

We strongly recommend that you apply online. It is quick, easy and secure. The benefits are that you can start, save, change and complete your application any time right up to the closing date. You will receive an email confirmation that your application has been received.

When you apply online you will not need to use any special code. You will enter your child's details and then tell us which school(s) you want.

Important dates

- 12 September 2023 information about secondary school transfers available online at oxfordshire.gov.uk/secondaryadmissions
- 31 October 2023 closing date for on-time applications. It is very important to apply on time. This will maximise your chances that your child will be offered one of your preferred schools.

- 13 November 2023 last date for confirmation of change of address to be considered on time or for late applications with mitigating reasons to be considered on time.
- ① 1 March 2024 if you apply online you will receive an email telling you the school offer. A letter may be sent by post as well. You will receive an email telling you if a letter has been sent. If you receive an email telling you that a letter has been sent by post but do not receive one by second-class post after a few days, please contact the School Admissions Team because it will contain important information.

What happens if I make a late application?

If you miss the closing date, your application will be considered later. This means:

- · Your child is less likely to be offered a place at a school you want.
- We will not write to you on 1 March 2024. We will send you an offer letter by secondclass post on 8 May 2024. We may also send an email if you apply late online.

Things to consider including travel to school and where to get more help and advice Please read all the important information we have published before you start your application. This information is available online at oxfordshire.gov.uk/secondaryadmissions

Make sure you submit your application **on time** and try to use **all four** preferences for schools. Listing more than one school does not reduce the chance that your child will be offered the first preference but makes it less likely that your child will be offered a school you do not want.

You also need to consider how your child would travel to your preferred school(s). The Council will only normally provide free travel assistance to the nearest school with an available Year 7 place to the registered home address (if it is over the statutory walking distance of three miles or the Council considers the route is unsafe). The Council will not provide free travel assistance from or to more than one address. Our policy on home to school transport is on our website and you need to read this policy to understand whether we will offer your child free travel to your preferred school(s):

If you would like more help to apply for a school place, contact the School Admissions Team. We look forward to receiving your child's application by **31 October 2023**.

Dear Parent/Carer

Your child's annual flu vaccination is due WINDMILL PRIMARY SCHOOL 10th October 2023

The annual school aged Flu vaccination programme is, this year, being offered to all children in Reception – Year 6. Flu can be a very unpleasant illness for children and sometimes causes serious complications. Children can catch and spread flu easily so vaccinating them also protects others who are vulnerable e.g babies and older people. This is particularly important as COVID-19 is still circulating and people at risk of flu are also vulnerable to the complications of COVID-19.

For most children, the vaccination is painless and given by a quick and simple spray up the nose.

In some circumstances it is necessary to administer the vaccine by intramuscular injection, but this is always discussed with parents/carers beforehand. You may also choose for the vaccination to be administered by intramuscular injection if you object to the nasal vaccination on the grounds of its contents (eg Porcine Gelatine) or if the vaccine is otherwise unsuitable. The intramuscular injection, if required, will also be delivered in school on the date above.

How do I provide Consent for my child to receive the vaccine?

It is important that you first read the information in the Flu Leaflet <u>Child flu vaccine - NHS</u> which includes details about the programme and the small number of children who may not be able to have the nasal spray. Due to the checking process' required please follow the steps below at least one full school day before the session to ensure your child can be vaccinated at school. Community clinics will be available across the county if your child has not been vaccinated in the school session.

- 1. **Click** the link https://www.oxfordhealthimms.co.uk/Forms/Flu
- 2. **Enter** the Unique School Code **OX123047**
- 3. **Complete** the form (one per child). Please complete even if you are REFUSING the vaccination*.

Information regarding the Flu Vaccination and Asthma and what to do if you change your mind is available below. Further information is also available at www.oxfordhealth.nhs.uk/imms/ including information about all our vaccination programmes.

Further Information

<u>Refusal of Vaccination</u>- If you do not wish your child to be vaccinated, and you would prefer not to be contacted again by our service this academic year regarding the Flu Vaccine, please complete a consent form selecting NO consent.

<u>Asthma or other illness</u> – We may not be able to safely vaccinate your child on the arranged date if your child is asthmatic and in the 3 days (72hrs) before the vaccination session your child has any of the following ...

They have increased wheezing

and/or

o have increased the use of their Bronchodilator

and/or

o they are currently taking or have been prescribed steroid tablets to control their asthma in the two weeks prior to the vaccination session in school

If the above occurs It is **very important** that you provide a written note with your child's name, dob, year group and the updating information to be given to the vaccination team on the day of vaccination. If your child is too young to be able to do this, please hand the letter to the school reception and ask that it is given to the vaccination team as they arrive and **mark it as urgent**. Please **also call** the Immunisation Team on 07920 254 400 before 08:45 on the day of vaccination.

<u>Withdrawing Consent/Vaccination given at GP Practice after Consent Form submitted</u> – If you submit a Consent Form and then change your mind and no longer wish your child to be vaccinated

or

you submit a Consent Form and then your child has their vaccination at the GP Practice before the school session

Please email <u>withdrawconsentSAIS@oxfordhealth.nhs.uk</u> at least one full school day before the session **and** on the day of the vaccination session provide a written note to your child's School Reception for the urgent attention of the Immunisation Team. Please state in the letter and in the email subject heading, your child's school, name, year group and date of birth.

<u>Translated Flu Leaflet-</u> The Flu leaflet is also available in the following languages <u>Albanian, Arabic, Bengali, Bulgarian, Chinese (simplified), Chinese (traditional, Cantonese), Estonian, Farsi, French, Greek, Gujarati, Hindi, Latvian, Lithuanian, Panjabi, Pashto, Polish, Port uguese, Romanian, Romany, Russian, Somali, Spanish, Tagalog, Turkish, Twi, Ukrainian, Urdu and Yiddish.</u>

*By providing a valid email address you will receive an automatic email confirming that you have completed the Consent Form. You will receive a further email following the vaccination session confirming and providing information regarding the vaccination that has been given or providing a reason why we may not have vaccinated your child eg if unwell or absent. These emails will be from school.immunisations@nhs.net and may go direct to your Junk folder.
